



AWARENESS OF THE CHARTER OF FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

Overall awareness of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union **has improved** since the last targeted Eurobarometers conducted in 2012 and 2019, with 49% of respondents having heard of the Charter (+6 pp compared to 2019 and +10 pp compared to 2012).

However, the share of those who really know what it is has remained the same since 2019 (12%).








INFORMATION ABOUT THE CHARTER

Only 19% of respondents feel **well informed about the Charter**, representing an increase since 2019 (+2 pp) and 2012 (+5pp). Only 1% of respondents spontaneously say that they have never heard of the Charter, representing a 10 pp decrease since 2019.
